## The View of the Field

After a very wet start the sun showed its face on the fields at Tal y Garth and brought a good crowd of people to the show.

The sheepdogs and their handlers battled through the rain at the start of the Open and the day went well with Glyn Jones, Llanarmon winning with his dog Jock. On Friday the Local was won by Rheinallt Hughes, Llanarmon with Roy and the Novice was won by Alun Jones, Selattyn with Denwyn Hemp.

It has been an unusual year for us with some big changes. Due to the number of entries this year it was the first time that no runs were held on Ty'n y Groes which was the original field for the trials since starting in 1903. We would like to thank Gareth Thomas and his family for the long-standing use of the field and look forward to being with them again next year.

We had a record number of entries in the sheep section with Overall Interbreed champion being won by Dafydd Edwards, Llanrhaeadr Ym Mochnant.

The shearing always draws a crowd and was judged this year by the current World Champion, Richard Jones. The Contractors competition was won by Tomos Jones, Penybont Fawr and the Farmers competition by Owen Martin-Jones of Nantyr, Glyn Ceiriog.

The Young farmers put on games and competitions that always add a bit of fun to the field.

We were very sad to announce that the horse show had been cancelled due to the outbreak of Equine Flu. The committee held an emergency meeting on August 8 after being informed that the horse section was being withdrawn. Unlike many other shows, the Ceiriog Valley Show is held on the site of a fully operational livery yard and, as such, we cannot risk introducing Equine Flu to the pasture. Whilst many owners vaccinate their animals we simply cannot take the risk, therefore, reluctantly, the decision was taken to withdraw the horse show this year.

The committee and its officials send our sincere apologies out to all those who were disappointed by this decision but hope you can understand that we are in the singular position of having a responsibility to our landlords and their business, as well as the wellbeing of the horses that normally graze on the show field. We did however introduce a number of new features, with a view to keeping an exciting and varied programme on the field, including Hawkeye Falconry, Dog Agility, Axe-Throwing, Croesoswallt Archery, Woodcrafting, Chainsaw Sculpture and Children's Rides. The atmosphere was fantastic and the activities were loved by young and old alike. There are some great pictures on the show's Facebook page. The society would like to pay special thanks to Mr. Jeff Eamens of Tal y Garth for the generous gesture of sponsoring the falconry. Heartfelt thanks go out to all our volunteers and contributors. The committee works all year on planning the show and thanks go out to those who attend the meetings.
